GENERAL INFORMATION

What has happened with visitation at ADC?

- On March 13, 2020, the Arizona Department of Corrections (ADC) <u>released a statement</u> suspending inperson visitation at all prison complexes due to concerns of spreading Coronavirus (COVID-19).
- Video visitation will be "explored" by ADC but is not available at this time.

How long will visitations be suspended?

- ADC says it is complying with industry standards of the <u>American Correctional Association</u> and the <u>National Commission on Correctional Health Care</u>* in reducing the spread.
- Current Center for Disease Control recommendations include cancelling gatherings of 10 people or more one reason why visits are closed.
- Visits are suspended until at least April 12, 2020. The situation should be re-evaluated at that time, but there is a chance it will be extended.

Letter Writing

- Sending letters acts not only as a way to communicate, but also gives the person something to look forward to and hold onto as a keepsake.
- You can make your own post cards, find low-cost greeting cards at thrift stores, and use postcard apps like Flikshop.
- PACKAGES CANNOT BE MAILED. If you would like to send a package, you must use the <u>SecurePak</u> system. Review DO 914 Inmate Mail if you have any questions.
- CDs and books can still be mailed through approved vendors.

Phone Calls

 On March 18, ADC announced that phone provider CenturyLink began providing two free 15-minute phone calls per week.

Emails (for those with tablets)

• In September 2019, a tablet program was offered to many ADC facilities under <u>Director's Instruction 380.</u> It is unclear who does and does not have a tablet.
